"I will sing praise with the spirit, but I will sing praise with the mind also." (I Cor. 14:15)

Having joined the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians in order to attend this summer's convention, I recently logged on to a Zoom "Happy Hour" meeting of association members. One of the participants was endorsing the position that church musicians are ministers of the Word and that music is a means of proclaiming the Word. This is the viewpoint that has led some to call J. S. Bach the Fifth Evangelist. I once generated a scholarly controversy by criticizing this view of Bach in print, and I am still not convinced that Luther regarded music as equivalent to preaching. But this did lead me to think about the multiple functions of music in worship at Good Shepherd.

Whether or not we regard hymns as proclamation, Pastor Chelsea and I do attempt to reinforce the scriptural texts through our choices of hymns for each service. It is gratifying when one of you (most often Stephanie Meister) comments on how well the hymns and scripture fit together. During Lent this year I joined Pastor Chelsea and the Wednesday Bible study group in a rewarding study of Lenten hymns. We came to appreciate the richness of meaning in hymn texts that merit deeper exploration than time allows on a Sunday morning. Important as the teaching role of music may be, I believe the greater function of music in worship is to give expression to our response to the Word through praising God and communicating our joy and commitment to the gospel. While this involves the whole congregation, I am particularly grateful to those of you who take on the responsibility of leadership through singing in the choir or Grace Alive! Each of these groups has led in worship each month this year, and, though attendance has been impacted by travel and illnesses or injuries, both groups have increased in numbers.

Special thanks are due to Debbie Gelormine as lead soprano in the choir and lead guitarist in Grace Alive! Dan Groth has continued to serve the group as sound engineer, assisted on occasion by James Thornton. We are grateful when Jeff Davis and Alex Duque are available to share their instrumental talents. The return of the Chilcoat family to Good Shepherd brought us not only two new choir members but an excellent saxophonist, Peter Chilcoat, who enriched our Christmas Eve worship as well as one Grace Alive! Sunday. Teri Weniger also shared her piano skills with a piano-organ duet and is an occasional keyboardist with Grace Alive! As much as the adult musical leadership is appreciated, the greatest joy comes when children sing in worship. We have not yet devised a way to have an organized children's choir, but small groups of children have sung anthems on several occasions this year, always delighting the congregation.







DUTIES OF CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEMBERS

(from our Constitution)

The duties of the Congregation Council shall include the following:

- a. To lead this congregation in stating its mission, to do long-range planning, to set goals and priorities, and to evaluate its activities in light of its mission and goals.
- b. To seek to involve all members of this congregation in worship, learning, witness, service, and support.
- c. To oversee and provide for the administration of this congregation to enable it to fulfill its functions and perform its mission.
- d. To maintain supportive relationships with the pastor(s) and staff and help them annually to evaluate the fulfillment of their calling, appointment, or employment.
- e. To be examples individually and corporately of the style of life and ministry expected of all baptized persons.
- f. To promote a congregational climate of peace and goodwill and as differences and conflicts arise, to endeavor to foster mutual understanding.
- g. To arrange for pastoral service during the sickness or absence of the pastor.
- h. To emphasize partnership with the Synod and church wide units of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America as well as cooperation with other congregations, both Lutheran and non-Lutheran, subject to established policies of the Synod and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- i. To recommend and encourage the use of program resources produced or approved by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- j. To seek out and encourage qualified persons to prepare for the ministry of the Gospel.

The Congregation Council shall:

- be responsible for the financial and property matters of this congregation.
- see that the provisions of this constitution, its bylaws, and the continuing resolutions are carried out.
- provide for an annual review of the membership roster.
- be responsible for the appointment and supervision of the salaried lay workers of this congregation.
- submit a comprehensive report to this congregation at the annual meeting.
- normally meet once a month. Special meetings may be called by a pastor or the president and shall be called at the request of at least one-half of its members.

[Council currently usually meets on the 2nd Tuesday of each month.]
